Select TWO of the following selections below to complete. Projects must be centered around novel plot elements (setting, characters, conflict, theme, plot, symbols, etc.)

PROJECT CHOICES #1-9:

1. Flash News Report
 - Create a short video news report that tells who, what, where, and when of the book.
 - Use built-in news template in iMovie or another technique of your choice. 2-4 minutes in length.
 - The student must be the anchorperson.
2. Book Cover
 - Create a new front and back cover for the book
 - Including a brief description for the back of the book that will make someone want to read it, but does not give anything away.
 - About 2 paragraphs
 - The book cover can be hand-drawn if it is: creative, elaborate, extensive, and detailed OR done via programs like Photoshop.
3. Make a Model
 - Construct a 3D model representative of some aspect of the book
 - May be from a kit
 - May use paper, clay, cardboard or any other materials of your choice
4. Theatrical Interpretation
 - Live or Recorded adaptation of a scene in the book that helps summarize the book
 - If performed live, you need to come prepared with costumes, scripts and anything else needed
5. Construct Musical Composition
 - Create a song that has two verses, one chorus, and one bridge. (Cannot be repetitive lyrics, except chorus)

- Can be to the tune of a pre-existing song or an original tune.
- Get creative; you may use programs such as Garbage Band or the like.
- Must have music behind the lyrics. Cannot be a cappella.

6. Web/Blog Activity

- Write a blog post that gives a 3-5 paragraph book report
- OR
- Create a webpage or website about your book

7. Poster

- Including: Summary of the plot and setting, characters and a brief description
- Include 3 or more pictures

8. Multi-Media Presentation

- PowerPoint, Keynote, iMovie, Prezi, or other tools you have available
- Include description of setting, characters, plot, and conflict

9. Timeline

- Includes, in the correct order, major events of the book, character development, and settings
- May be completed on paper or using software or an app
