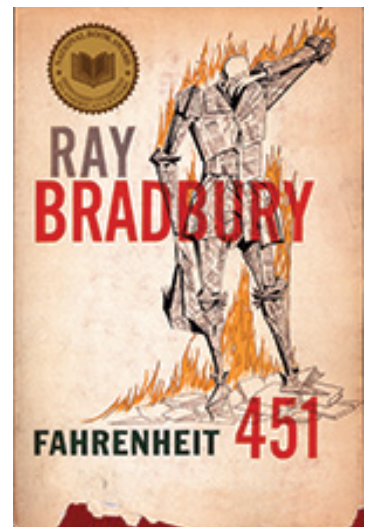
Directions:

- Read “*Fahrenheit 451*: Censorship and the First Amendment” (included in this packet)
- Read *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury

- Review your resource: How to Write an Epilogue for a Novel.
- Write an original, imaginative epilogue to the story. It can be days, weeks, months, or years in the future.
- Choose any character from the book, or create a new character. If you develop a new character, be certain to explain how this character fits into the original storyline. Write your epilogue in **first-person point of view**.
- Give your epilogue a title.
- Revise and edit your epilogue.

- The final draft of your epilogue must be **typed** using an easy-to-read, size 12-point font (such as Century Gothic, Times New Roman, or Calibri). The epilogue must be limited to three (3) typed pages.
- Use only the front sides of 8.5" X 11" plain, white paper.
- Line spacing must be double-spaced using 1" margins on top, bottom, and sides.
- Keep in mind the Six-Traits of Writing: idea development, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, and conventions. See rubric on the reverse side of this page.
- Be creative and have fun with this assignment!

- Bring all drafts and your final draft to school on the due date.
